
Roanoke is a forest city. CITY OF ROANOKE URBAN FORESTRY



DID YOU KNOW?



Roanoke is home to 158 types of trees, including Maples, Oaks, Elms, Dogwoods and Cherry trees



Roanoke has over 7,577 acres of tree canopy, which is over 27% of the city



Each year, roughly 15 Commemorative Trees are donated to the city



The city's trees annually help to reduce water runoff by 153.7 million gallons, saving the city \$1.7 million in stormwater management

WHAT IS URBAN FORESTRY?

The City of Roanoke's Urban Forestry team of professionals is responsible for maintaining a healthy forest ecosystem in the city. The department of Parks and Recreation's Urban Forestry Plan was adopted in 2003 and has been featured in USA Today! Roanoke is also nationally recognized as a Tree City USA.

WHAT WE DO:

Tree maintenance, tree and stump removals, tree planting, reforestation, insect and disease control, inspections, surveys and storm response. The Urban Forestry team also celebrates Arbor Day, offers the Commemorative Tree Program, and provides educational and volunteer training programs.
